The Holy Family of Jesus, Mary and Joseph

Sirach 3:2-6, 12-14

God sets a father in honor over his children; a mother's authority he confirms over her sons. Whoever honors his father #atones for sins, and preserves himself from them.

When he prays, he is heard;

he stores up riches who reveres his mother.

Whoever honors his father is gladdened by children, and, when he prays, is heard.

Whoever reveres his father will live a long life; he who obeys his father brings comfort to his mother.

My son, take care of your father when he is old; grieve him not as long as he lives. Even if his mind fail, be considerate of him; revile him not all the days of his life; kindness to a father will not be forgotten, firmly planted against the #debt of your sins —a house raised in justice to you.

The Wisdom of **SIRACH** is simple: Respect your Mother and Father. Care for them, when they are old as they cared for you when you were young.

Reverence for your parents will stand like an olive tree as # to repair damage from your sins.

The 'image' is **olive trees**: firmly planted & olive plants Olive Trees last 2,00 years!

More on olive trees:

They take over 40

years to begin giving

fruit!

= PATIENCE.

Psalm 128:1-2, 3, 4-5.

R. Blessed are those who fear the Lord and walk in his ways.

Blessed is everyone who fears the LORD, who walks in his ways!

For you shall eat the fruit of your handiwork;

blessed shall you be, and favored. Blessed are those who fear the Lord and walk in his ways

Your wife shall be like a **fruitful vine** in the recesses of your home; your children like olive plants around your table.

Blessed are those who fear the Lord and walk in his ways

Behold, thus is the man blessed / who fears the LORD.

The LORD bless you from Zion: / may you see the prosperity of Jerusalem

all the days of your life. Blessed are those who fear the Lord and walk in his ways

Colossians 3:12-21

Brothers and sisters:

Put on, as God's chosen ones, holy and beloved, heartfelt compassion, kindness, humility, gentleness, and patience, bearing with one another and forgiving one another, if one has a grievance against another; as the Lord has forgiven you, so must you also do.

Paul applies the ideas of SIRACH to the 'CHURCH Family'.

And over all these put on love, that is, the bond of perfection. And let the peace of Christ control your hearts,

the peace into which you were also called in one body.

And be thankful.

Let the word of Christ dwell in you richly,

as in all wisdom you teach and admonish one another,

singing psalms, hymns, and spiritual songs

with gratitude in your hearts to God.

And whatever you do, in word or in deed,

do everything in the name of the Lord Jesus,

giving thanks to God the Father through him.

{These following lines may be omitted, since they are often mis-understood today!}

[Wives, be subordinate to your husbands,

as is proper in the Lord.

Husbands, love your wives,

and avoid any bitterness toward them.

Children, obey your parents in everything,

for this is pleasing to the Lord.

Fathers, do not provoke your children,

so they may not become discouraged.]

Pretty much what SIRACH said about relating to others.

Note: ONE duty for wives; ONE for kids; TWO for men.

a) Love your wives; NO bitterness!

b) Dads, don't be too hard on your kids.

{My kids when they were younger seized on these last 2 lines! LOL }

Colossians 3:15a, 16a

Let the peace of Christ control your hearts; let the word of Christ dwell in you richly. R. Alleluia, alleluia.

Gospel Matt 2:13-15, 19-23

When the magi had departed, behold, the angel of the Lord appeared to Joseph in a dream and said, "Rise, take the child and his mother, flee to Egypt, and stay there until I tell you.

Herod is going to search for the child to destroy him." Joseph rose and took the child and his mother by night and departed for Egypt.

He stayed there until the death of Herod,

that what the Lord had said through the prophet might be fulfilled,

Out of Egypt I called my son.

{Hosea 11:1, see intro}

When Herod had died, behold,

the angel of the Lord appeared *in a dream* to Joseph in Egypt and said,

Are YOU "awake" to God's message? Will you listen when God talks?--

"Rise, take the child and his mother and go to the land of Israel, even in unexpected ways? for those who sought the child's life are dead."

He rose, took the child and his mother,

and went to the land of Israel.

Note again Matt emphasizes the faith of Joseph, and his faithful actions.

{LUKE tells his story from MARY's view; her faith and trust in God.} But when he heard that Archelaus* was ruling over Judea in place of his father Herod, he was afraid to go back there.

And because he had been warned *in a dream*, he departed for the region of Galilee.

He went and dwelt in a town called Nazareth#, so that what had been spoken through the prophets might be fulfilled, He shall be called a Nazorean#.

{*one of Herod's sons; so bad that the Romans got rid of him after 1 year.}

{Notice again that Joseph is OPEN to God's message.}

So instead of returning to Bethlehem which is in Judea, Joseph took Mary and Jesus to Galilee, in the north.
