Anguish has taken wing, dispelled is darkness:

He said to them, "Come after me, and I will make you fishers of men."

At once they left their nets and followed him.

He walked along from there and saw two other brothers, James, the son of Zebedee, and his brother John.

They were in a boat, with their father Zebedee, mending their nets.

He called them, and immediately they left their boat and their father and followed him.

He went around all of Galilee, teaching in their synagogues,

\*proclaiming the gospel of the kingdom,

and curing every disease and illness among the people.

I am always amused at those who point to their Xtian neighbors who are NOT perfect. and are scandalized that all Xtians are not perfect.

Paul and Acts and James all comment on the quarreling going on in the Early Church.

Why? Because they and we are working our way through life, w God's grace, trying to do our best.

We ARE imperfect.

Did you note the words HERE and in Isaiah (above) are not exactly identical? That is because a definitive TEXT had not been established; but everyone knew the ESSENTIAL words of Isaiah.

More important! They learned it orally.
